A RETREAT FOR THE AGES

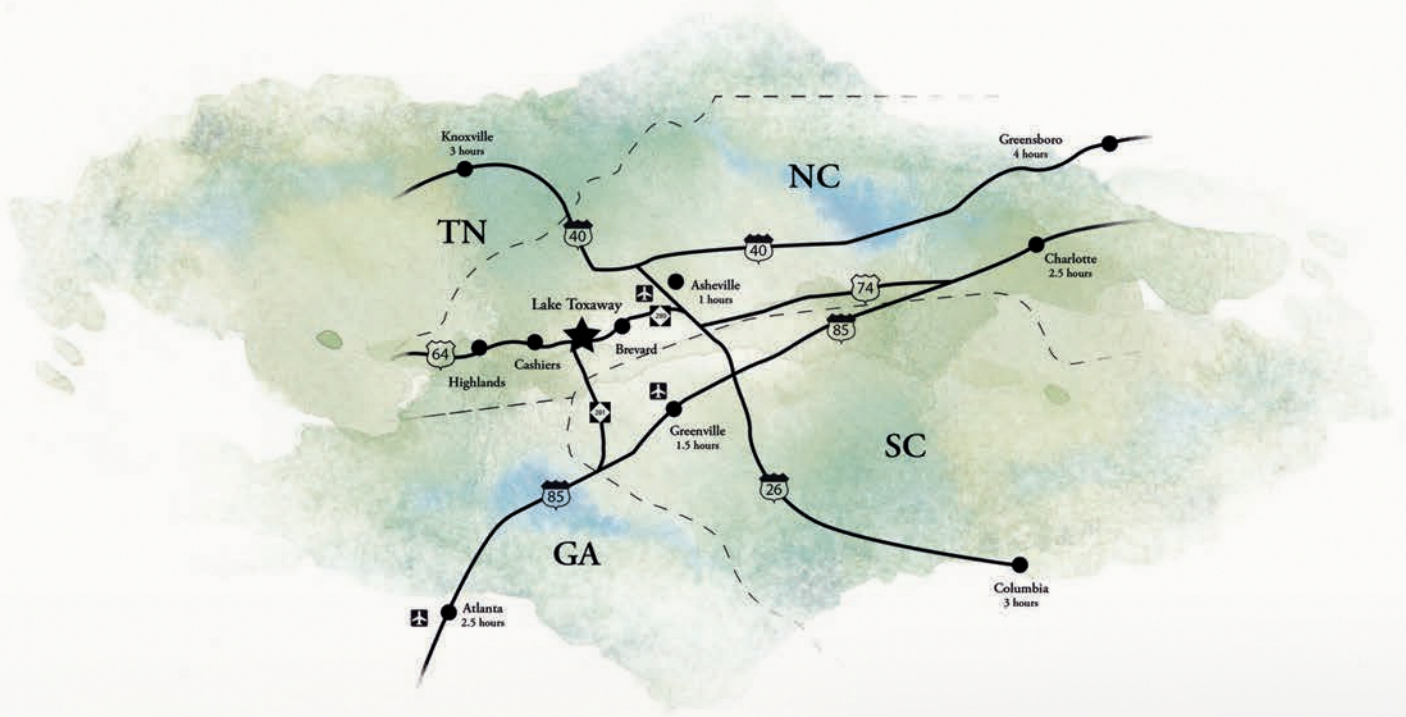
In the early 1900s, when a few visionary men dammed the Toxaway River and built the five-story Toxaway Inn, a resort was born. A decade or so later, however, after a series of floods and tropical storms, the dam burst. And just like that, the lake—and the tourists—disappeared. It wasn't until 1960, when Reg Heinitsh and a group of investors rebuilt the dam, restored the lake, and began attracting a new generation of visitors. Today, Lake Toxaway stretches out like an oasis in a naturally preserved mountain setting, covering 640 acres and some 14 miles of scenic shoreline that's as inviting as it is rare.

It's hard to imagine a more perfect setting in Western North Carolina than Lake Toxaway Estates, home to the state's largest private lake. From the Asheville Airport (I-26, Exit 40), turn right (west) on Hwy 280 toward Brevard. In Brevard, Hwy 280 will merge with Hwy 64. Follow Hwy 64 through Brevard about 15 miles to Lake Toxaway on the right.
